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BUSINESS EMPLOYMENT DYNAMICS – FOURTH QUARTER 2025

From September 2025 to December 2025, gross job gains from expanding and opening private-sector establishments were 7.8 million, an increase of 363,000 jobs from the previous quarter, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. Over this period, gross job losses from contracting and closing private-sector establishments were 7.2 million, a decrease of 389,000 jobs from the previous quarter. (See tables A and 1.)

The change in the number of jobs over time is the net result of increases and decreases in employment that occur at all private businesses in the economy. Business Employment Dynamics (BED) statistics track these changes in employment at private-sector establishments from the third month of one quarter to the third month of the next. The difference between the number of gross job gains and the number of gross job losses is the net change in employment. (See Technical Note.) The BED data series include gross job gains and gross job losses by industry subsector for the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, as well as gross job gains and gross job losses at the firm level by employer size class.

Gross Job Gains

In the fourth quarter of 2025, gross job gains represented 5.9 percent of private-sector employment. Gross job gains are the sum of increases in employment due to expansions at existing establishments and the addition of new jobs at opening establishments. Expanding establishments gained 6.2 million jobs in the fourth quarter of 2025, and opening establishments gained 1.6 million jobs. (See tables A, 1, 2, and 3.)

Gross Job Losses

In the fourth quarter of 2025, gross job losses represented 5.5 percent of private-sector employment. Gross job losses are the result of contractions in employment at existing establishments and the loss of jobs at closing establishments. Contracting establishments lost 5.8 million jobs in the fourth quarter of 2025, and closing establishments lost 1.4 million jobs. (See tables A, 1, 2, and 3.)

Establishment Births and Deaths

In the fourth quarter of 2025, there were 338,000 establishment births which accounted for 1,006,000 jobs. Data for establishment deaths are available through the first quarter of 2025, when 809,000 jobs were lost at 284,000 establishments. (See Technical Note and table 8.)

Firm Size

In the fourth quarter of 2025, firms with 1 to 49 employees had a net employment increase of 194,000. Firms with 50 to 249 employees experienced a net employment gain of 138,000. Firms with 250 or more employees added 126,000 net jobs. (See tables 4 and 5.)

States

Gross job gains surpassed gross job losses in 42 states, the District of Columbia, and the Virgin Islands in the fourth quarter of 2025. (See tables 6 and 7.)

Industries

Gross job gains exceeded gross job losses in 10 out of 13 industry sectors in the fourth quarter of 2025. The service-providing industries experienced a net job gain of 588,000. The goods-producing industries had a net job increase of 5,000. (See table 3.)

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New Jersey Employment Report: June 2026

TRENTON – Preliminary nonfarm employment labor market estimates for June, produced by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, indicate that New Jersey payrolls decreased by 300 over the month, resulting in a seasonally adjusted employment level of 4,387,100 jobs. The state’s unemployment rate decreased by 0.2 percentage points to 4.5 percent from May to June.

Employment estimates for May were revised downward to show an April to May gain of 1,400 (preliminary estimates: +2,200). The state’s unemployment rate for May was unchanged at 4.7 percent.

Over the past month, five out of nine private industry sectors recorded employment gains compared to May. Those sectors were professional and business services (+3,700), private education and health services (+3,600), construction (+500), manufacturing (+500), and other services (+500). Sectors that recorded job losses include trade, transportation, and utilities (-4,200), leisure and hospitality (-3,700), information (-900), and financial activities (-300). The public sector recorded a loss of 100 jobs for the month.

Over the year, the state recorded a total gain of 8,000 nonfarm jobs, with the private sector recording a gain of 10,100 jobs. Two private industry sectors recorded year-over-year gains over that span: private education and health services (+31,000) and professional and business services (+6,100). Losses were recorded year-over-year in trade, transportation, and utilities (-8,400), manufacturing (-4,600), leisure and hospitality (-3,900), information (-3,300), construction (-3,000), financial activities (-3,000), and other services (-800). The public sector recorded a loss of 2,100 jobs over the same timeframe.

Technical Notes: Estimates of industry employment and unemployment levels are arrived at through the use of two different monthly surveys.

Industry employment data are derived through the Current Employment Statistics (CES) survey, a monthly survey of approximately 4,000 business establishments conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) of the U.S. Department of Labor, which provides estimates of employment, hours, and earnings data broken down by industry for the nation as a whole, all states, and most major metropolitan areas (often referred to as the “establishment” survey).

Resident employment and unemployment data are mainly derived from the New Jersey portion of the national Current Population Survey (CPS), a household survey conducted each month by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with BLS, which provides input to the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program (often referred to as the “household” survey).

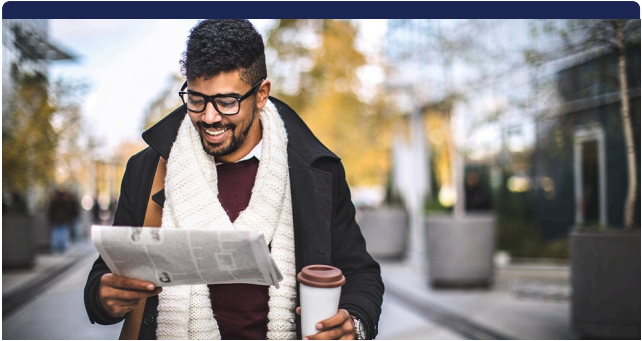
Both industry and household estimates are revised each month based on additional information from updated survey reports compiled by BLS. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from New Jersey’s Unemployment Compensation Law administrative records and more complete data from all New Jersey employers.

Effective with the release of January 2018 estimates, the Current Employment Statistics (CES) program has converted to concurrent seasonal adjustment, which uses all available estimates, including those for the current month, in developing seasonal factors. Previously, the CES program developed seasonal factors once a year during the annual benchmark process.

Metropolitan Area Employment and Unemployment Summary

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METROPOLITAN AREA EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT - JUNE 2026

Unemployment rates were higher in June than a year earlier in 184 of the 387 metropolitan areas, lower in 178 areas, and unchanged in 25 areas, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. A total of 15 areas had jobless rates of less than 3.0 percent and 7 areas had rates of at least 8.0 percent. Nonfarm payroll employment increased over the year in 15 metropolitan areas, decreased in 3 areas, and was essentially unchanged in 369 areas. The national unemployment rate in June was 4.4 percent, not seasonally adjusted, the same as a year earlier.

This news release presents statistics from two monthly programs. The civilian labor force and unemployment data are based on the same concepts and definitions as those used for the national household survey estimates. These data pertain to people by where they reside. The employment data are from an establishment survey that measures nonfarm employment, hours, and earnings by industry. These data pertain to jobs on payrolls defined by where the establishments are located. For more information about the concepts and statistical methodologies used by these two programs, see the Technical Note.

Metropolitan Area Unemployment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

In June, Sioux Falls, SD-MN, had the lowest unemployment rate, 1.9 percent, followed by Rapid City, SD, 2.0 percent. El Centro, CA, had the highest rate, 17.6 percent. A total of 226 areas had June jobless rates below the U.S. rate of 4.4 percent, 145 areas had rates above it, and 16 areas had rates equal to that of the nation. (See table 1.)

The largest over-the-year unemployment rate increase in June occurred in Lake Havasu City-Kingman, AZ (+1.7 percentage points), followed by Sierra Vista-Douglas, AZ (+1.5 points). Twenty-one other areas had rate increases of at least 1.0 percentage point. Kokomo, IN, had the largest over-the-year rate decrease in June (-1.9 percentage points). Eighteen other areas had rate decreases of at least 1.0 percentage point.

Of the 56 metropolitan areas with a 2020 Census population of 1 million or more, Raleigh-Cary, NC, and Urban Honolulu, HI, had the lowest jobless rates in June, 3.1 percent each. Fresno, CA, had the highest rate, 7.7 percent. Twenty-seven large areas had over-the-year unemployment rate decreases, 26 had increases, and 3 had no change. The largest rate decline occurred in Columbus, OH (-1.2 percentage points). The largest jobless rate increase occurred in Hartford-West Hartford-East Hartford, CT (+1.3 percentage points).

Metropolitan Division Unemployment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

Thirteen of the most populous metropolitan areas are made up of 37 metropolitan divisions, which are essentially separately identifiable employment centers. In June, Rockingham County-Strafford County, NH, had the lowest division unemployment rate, 2.5 percent. Detroit-Dearborn-Livonia, MI, had the highest rate among the divisions, 6.5 percent. (See table 2.)

In June, 19 metropolitan divisions had over-the-year unemployment rate decreases, 17 had increases, and 1 had no change. The largest decline occurred in Newark, NJ (-1.0 percentage point). The largest unemployment rate increases from June 2025 occurred in Chicago-Naperville-Schaumburg, IL; Detroit-Dearborn-Livonia, MI; and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Sunrise, FL (+0.8 percentage point each).

Metropolitan Area Nonfarm Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

In June 2026, nonfarm payroll employment increased over the year in 15 metropolitan areas, decreased in 3 areas, and was essentially unchanged in 369 areas. The largest over-the-year employment increases occurred in Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington, TX (+54,600), Las Vegas-Henderson-North Las Vegas, NV (+33,500), and Phoenix-Mesa-Chandler, AZ (+33,200). The largest over-the-year percentage gains in employment occurred in Athens-Clarke County, GA (+4.1 percent), and Auburn-Opelika, AL (+3.3 percent), followed by Fayetteville-Springdale-Rogers, AR, and Las Vegas-Henderson-North Las Vegas, NV (+2.9 percent each). The over-the-year decreases in employment occurred in Washington-Arlington-Alexandria, DC-VA-MD-WV (-83,500, or -2.4 percent), Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro, OR-WA (-25,700, or -2.1 percent), and Bloomington, IN (-3,300, or -4.2 percent). (See table 3.)

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased in 10 metropolitan areas with a 2020 Census population of 1 million or more, decreased in 2 areas, and was essentially unchanged in 44 areas. The largest over-the-year percentage increase in employment occurred in Las Vegas-Henderson-North Las Vegas, NV (+2.9 percent), followed by Salt Lake City-Murray, UT (+2.7 percent), and Raleigh-Cary, NC (+2.6 percent). Over the year, employment decreased in

Washington-Arlington-Alexandria, DC-VA-MD-WV (-2.4 percent), and Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro, OR-WA (-2.1 percent).

Metropolitan Division Nonfarm Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

In June, nonfarm payroll employment increased over the year in 2 metropolitan divisions, decreased in 2 divisions, and was essentially unchanged in 33 divisions. The over-the-year increases in employment occurred in New York-Jersey City-White Plains, NY-NJ (+66,800, or +1.0 percent), and Dallas-Plano-Irving, TX (+39,000, or +1.3 percent). The over-the-year decreases in employment occurred in Washington, DC-MD (-49,400, or -4.3 percent), and Frederick-Gaithersburg-Bethesda, MD (-13,600, or -2.2 percent). (See table 4.)

2026 Preliminary Benchmark Revision to Establishment Survey Data
to be Published on August 28, 2026

Each year, Current Employment Statistics (CES) estimates are benchmarked to comprehensive counts of employment from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW). These counts are derived from state unemployment insurance (UI) tax records that nearly all employers are required to file. As part of the benchmark process for benchmark year 2026, census-derived employment counts replace CES payroll employment estimates for all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and about 430 metropolitan areas and divisions for the period from April 2025 to September 2026.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) will release first-quarter 2026 data from the QCEW on August 28, 2026, at 10:00 a.m. (ET). At the same time, BLS will publish preliminary benchmark revisions for March 2026 for all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and select metropolitan areas at the total nonfarm level. The final benchmark revisions for all state and metropolitan area series will be issued with the publication of the January 2027 State Employment and Unemployment news release in March 2027.

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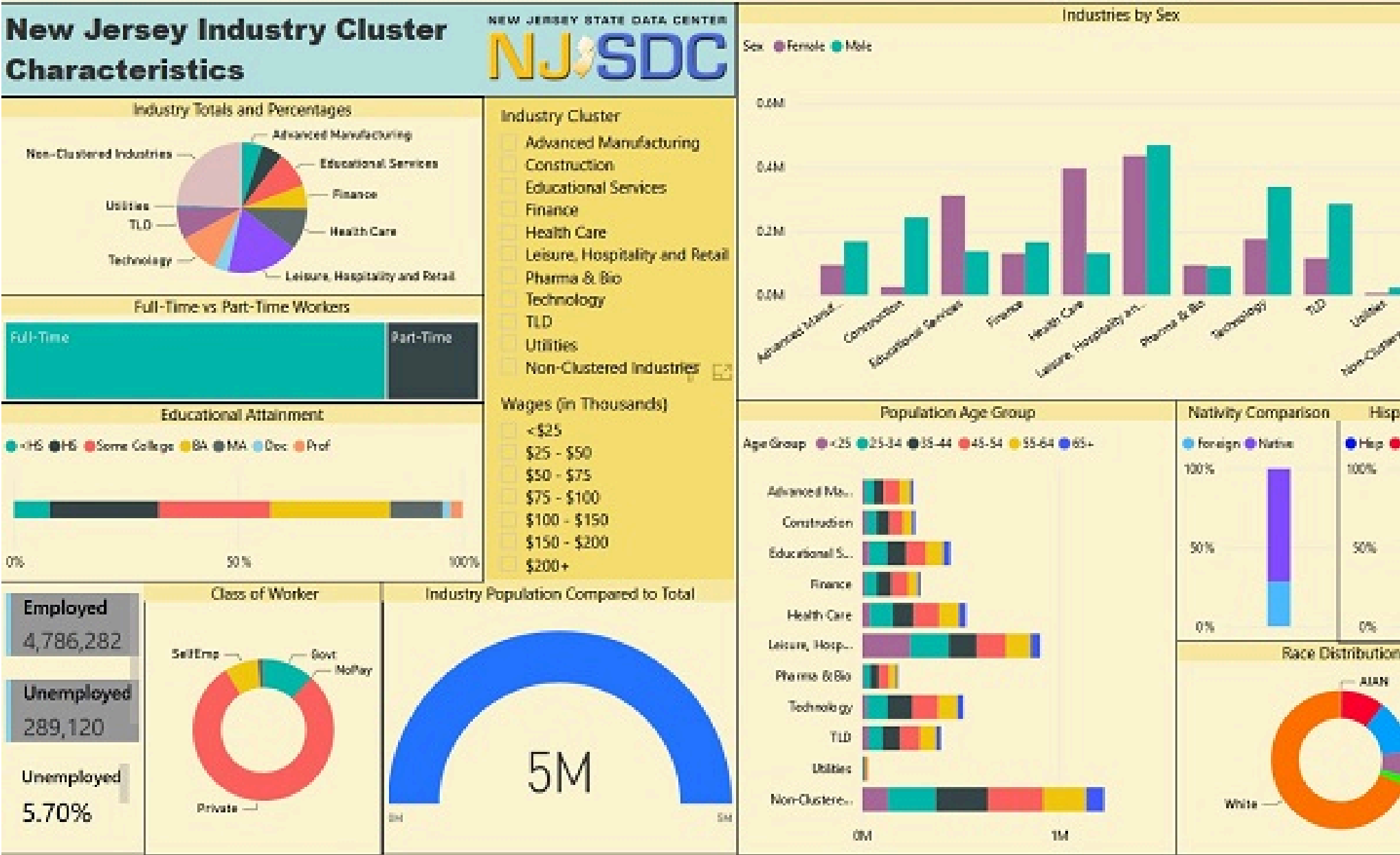
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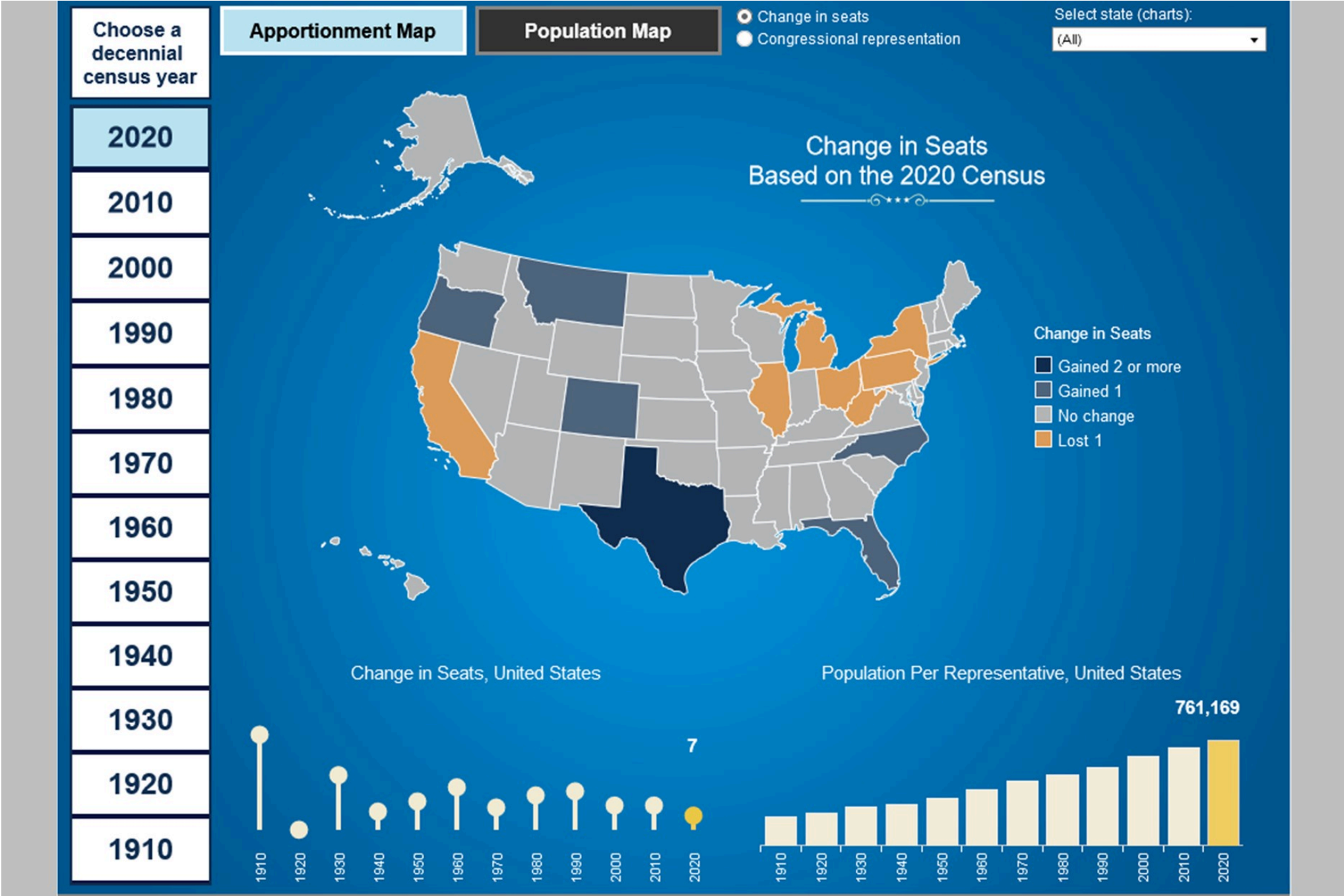
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
